Burbank Community YMCA Child Development Center Hosts Open House May 20th

Event Launches New Programs to Help Working Parents

According to the National Association of the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the demand for early childhood care and education programs continues to increase, not only in response to the growing demand for out-of-home childcare but in recognition of the critical importance of educational experiences during the early years.

Several decades of research demonstrate that high-quality, developmentally appropriate, early childhood programs produce short- and long-term positive effects on children's cognitive and social development.

The Burbank Community YMCA Child Development Center (CDC), a NAEYC and California Association of the Education of Young Children (CAEYC) accredited facility, is holding an open house on May 20 to showcase how enrolling young children in preschool, modified kindergarten or before/after-school programs helps kids reach their full potential.

The CDC will also be announcing new programs they are adding later this year that will help busy parents.

Commented Angela Buck, director of the preschool, "The Child Development Center provides a loving and stimulating environment, where children discover, explore, experiment and grow at their own pace. We utilize a play-based model approach to learning that honors each child's individual growth and development

and fosters each child's social, emotional, cognitive and physical development. It is a place where parents can be assured that their kids are safe and learning in a fun environment."

The CDC also offers before- and after-school programs that provide enrichment care for school age children in kindergarten through eighth grade. It includes homework support, healthy snacks, arts and humanities, outdoor games, sports, S.T.E.M. learning and special interest clubs such as theater, music and cooking. There are also optional, extra-curricular activities offered

at the main YMCA facility including gymnastics, basketball, dancing and swimming.

Transportation is provided to and from nearby schools and care for when Burbank schools are closed.

Annual Campaign Supports Community Members in Need

There was an excitement in the air as more than 50 Burbank Community YMCA volunteers, Board Members, staff and their families gathered at Simmzy’s Restaurant on April 7 to announce and celebrate the goal-busting results of their fundraising efforts. For the last month, volunteers



reached out to people in the Burbank and YMCA community as part of the Annual Campaign, an effort to raise money for the Y’s Financial Assistance fund.

Mary Cutone, Burbank YMCA Interim CEO, started off the night thanking everyone involved and commenting that the energy during this Annual Campaign was the most positive she had ever felt. “I don’t have to tell you - but I will - that the funds you have raised will go a long way towards helping us keep the Burbank YMCA accessible to everyone in our community who wants to be part of our family.”

David Escobar, Burbank YMCA Board Chair, also thanked everyone present for their efforts. “If fundraising is a marathon, this has been a sprint,” he said to the audience eager to hear the final results.

Volunteer team captains took turns taking the mic to share how much their teams raised, and how the Y made a difference in their lives.

“When I moved to Burbank I didn’t know anyone and I didn’t have much,” shared Debbie Cherry, a campaigner whose team collected 33 pledges and raised \$2,520. “When I joined the Y and they gave me Financial Assistance, it brought me into a community, gave me friends, and gave me a new start in a new place.”

Sandy Thompson, who serves on the board of several other Burbank nonprofits, including Family Promise of the Verdugos, shared why she volunteered for the Y, “I’m helping raise funds to support the Y’s partnerships with other organizations. Right now one of our Family

Promise guest families have a toddler that has been homeless virtually her whole life. The Y is providing them Financial Assistance so she can enroll in preschool. Within just a couple of weeks, having the structure she needed for the first time in her life made a huge difference in her. It’s

been the best thing that ever happened to her, and it also allows her mother to look for work during the day, so the family can get back on their feet.”

“Getting involved in the campaign was a great way for me to hear other members’ personal Y stories. I discovered that when members like you and me share our passion for the Y we can be really effective as fundraisers,” said Myeisha Peguero Gamiño, the Y’s newest Board Member. “This work is important because of the need in our community. Around 10% of the Burbank population lives in poverty and the Y is doing its part to meet those needs. Nearly 4 out of every 10 YMCA members receive financial assistance to help them afford the Y’s services, and we subsidize members over \$300,000 a year.”

Yvette Herrera, Director of Philanthropy, wrapped up the night with the long-awaited announcement. “Have you been doing the math?” she asked after all the team captains shared their totals. “We raised \$56,450, easily surpassing our goal of \$50,000!” She announced as cheers erupted from the audience.

Later on, Herrera commented, “This month-long phase of the Annual Campaign is just one element of a year-round fundraising effort that includes the Burbank Turkey Trot, support from foundations and businesses, and Board fundraising. We are so thankful for the volunteers here tonight who helped us raise a significant portion of that total.”

This year's "Burbank On Parade" celebration was certainly one for the record books!

There were more activities, more entries, bigger crowds and more food trucks, than ever before! A big "thank you" to our Chairman, Will Andrews, and to everyone who helped

assemble our entry and who walked the parade route! Now it's time to take everything apart and get ready to start working on our 2017 Rose Parade entry: Home Tweet Home!

The May-June timeframe is when the Burbank Water and Power mechanics take back their chassis for it's annual inspection. In order to give them full access to the transmission, hydraulics, electrical systems and both engines, we need to remove every last bit of the framework from last year's float. Fortunately, a simple twist and some grunting, on more than forty nuts and bolts, will allow us to remove the remaining framework in one piece! After the inspection, when we get the chassis back, we can re-install the framework with those same 40+ bolts.

Reusing the framework allows us to avoid the 2-3 weeks of work needed to build a new framework which would be unique for a particular float. As long as

the location of the driver's compartment doesn't change and extra beefy supports are not needed, reuse works fine. However, because the rest of the float structure is welded directly to this basic framework, metal fatigue eventually takes a toll and the old framework must be sent to the recycling bin and a new one must

be built every few years.

As yet, we haven't completely filled our Key Three committee chairs. Bob Ford is serving as Design Chairman and has led the process of converting the design concept into a winning float design. Jon Reeves will again serve as Construction Chairman and will convert the paper plans into steel. The Decoration Chairperson has not yet been selected, but there are many volunteers with many years of experience! With a small amount of arm twisting, we should have a full team ready and able to put another trophy winner on Colorado Blvd!

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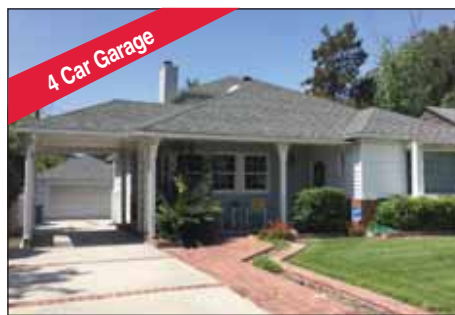
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I Know You Know Someone!
