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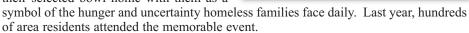

Participants Create Apps Built on YMCA's Tenets of Youth Development, Healthy Living & Social Responsibility

Recognizing the importance of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) initiatives in education - as well as engaging demographics under-represented in STEM, including veterans, women and minorities - the Burbank Community YMCA, Nickelodeon and the City of Burbank are joining forces for a three-day hackathon event, Game+Hack 2014.

Taking place May 2-4 at Nickelodeon Animation Studio in Burbank, the event partners students, teachers, developers, designers and novices with mentors from NASA-Jet Propulsion Laboratory, the studios including DreamWorks, Sony and Warner Bros. - and technology companies to build creative mobile apps, providing non-technical individuals with the opportunity for a hands-on experience. Participants will create apps in four categories: Youth Development, Healthy Living, Social Responsibility and Open Creativity. NASA-Jet Propulsion Laboratory's Chief Technology Officer, Tom Soderstrom, will deliver the keynote speech. Opening ceremony and judging are open to the public.

Game+Hack 2014 is a hackathon, an event at which computer programmers and others involved in software development collaborate intensively for a day or more on software projects. A venue for self-expression and creativity through technology, they produce websites, mobile apps and robots, or sometimes even a hardware device. Hackathons are also educational/social events where tools are provided to more novice enthusiasts, allowing them to collaboratively conceive, create and code usable software. Generally, a hackathon tends to have a specific focus, which can include the programming language used, the operating system, an application, an API, or the subject and the demographic group of the programmers.

A "Hack Camp" will be offered to non-technical participants on the first night to provide the basic skills and confidence necessary to participate in Game+Hack 2014. The Grand Prize winner will receive a mentoring day with an industry executive and assistance with taking their app to the next level. 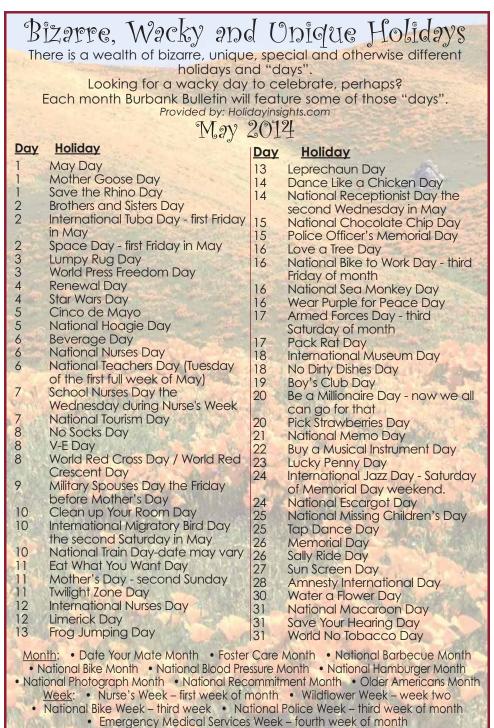

This is the time of year when, judging by the activity level at the float construction site, nothing is happening. Depending on when you visit, the float chassis might even be missing. Don't be fooled! There is a lot of activity happening behind the scenes!

The float chassis is scheduled for its annual inspection and might be located in the BWP maintenance garage. This year, tournament inspectors will also be checking "under the hood" with BWP techni-

The theme for the 2015 Rose Parade is "Inspiring Stories." Thanks to our float design contest winners Bill & Carol Cotter and Stacia Martin, Burbank will celebrate that theme with a humorous salute to volunteer firefighters. Imagine how various jungle animals might come together to help fight a fire in a mother toucan's tree

Artist Stacia Martin is working to produce the final line drawing of the float design. Next the Deco Team, led by Chairman Janet Meir, will use the drawing and their colored pencils and flower catalogs to determine what colors go where and which flowers can be used to achieve the desired effects.

With the jungle theme, there will likely be some pretty exotic flowers!

Construction Chairman, Bob Symons, will start to make some decisions about the underlying support structure. The structure is not welded directly to the float chassis. Instead, there are nearly two dozen welding plates which are bolted to the chassis. These plates will hold the entire structure of the finished float! The construction team will also consider how to animate the key characters and possibly add some water effects! Those first welds might even happen this month!

Now is the perfect time to come down to the construction "Barn" and learn a new skill! If your fingers are still numb from filling flower vials with icy cold water or your eyes are crossed from separating rice grains from lettuce seeds, now is the time to learn how do screening or chicken wiring or even welding!
