## The Aktion Club's Fashion Show a Rousing Success!!!



## **Pre-Dental Students** Mentored by Kids' Community Dental Clinic

The Kids' Community Dental Clinic visits 5 local high schools each year to talk to students about oral health. During these visits, dental professionals and health educators discuss the students' personal oral health, the importance of managing their own health, they offer students the chance to become a patient, they offer volunteer opportunities for school-required service learning, and they also talk about the field of dentistry - Dentist, Dental Hygienist, Dental Assistant, Dental Lab Technician.

As a result of these high school lectures and the Clinic's robust website, students contact the Clinic to find out more about the field of Dentistry. They can tour the Clinic, shadow the dentists, volunteer to learn more about the field of dentistry. More important, students want to find out whether they would be suited for a career within the dental field. One way is to work in the environment by volunteering.

Each year, the Clinic receives over two dozen calls from students interested in dentistry. If a student follows through by coming to tour, submits their resume and application, and fulfills other basic requirements, they are able to start volunteering. Volunteer work can consist of office support, data input and analysis, recording data at school visits, working public health events on weekends, becoming certified to work directly with patients and dentists, assisting staff at events and at schools, and/or working with dental instruments and dental supplies. Because the Clinic is mostly staffed by volunteers, the students interested in dental careers (called pre-dental students) are highly valued and become an integral part of providing services to children in need. If a student is willing to invest in classes to become certified, they can have more duties within the operation.

Pre-dental students who volunteer can receive so much more hands on experience, including: informal mentoring by the

volunteer dentists and dental hygienists; participating in dental product demonstrations; taking mock dental aptitude quizzes available at the Clinic; checking out Dental Admission Test study books (to take home) well before time for testing (i.e., Sophomore and/or Junior years); touring various dental schools throughout Southern California; and receiving a letter of recommendation by the Clinic Director (a dental school admissions requirement).

To date, about 26 pre-dental students have volunteered to gain experience before going on to dental school. Though one or two have decided not to pursue the field, 8 are currently in 3 different dental schools throughout California. Another 2 will enter Dental School this fall, and the others continue to volunteer to gain valuable experience. Through a grant from the California Wellness Foundation, the Kids' Community Dental Clinic was able to take students on tours of 3 local dental schools this Summer. The Kids' Community Dental Clinic, which annually serves hundreds of our lower income children and families from Burbank and local surrounding communities has opportunities for students who are interested in the field of Dentistry. If you are interested in more information about

## **Burbank Community YMCA** Wraps Up 90th Anniversary Celebration With Festivities



The First Baptist Church, at Magnolia and Third in Burbank, was purchased by the Y in 1932.



Renovations began in 1948, with an improved YMCA facility re-opening in 1949.

As the Burbank Community YMCA wraps up a year-long celebration of its 90th anniversary with a gala fundraiser under the stars on Oct. 9 at Nickelodeon Animation Studio and its fifth annual Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving day, we are reminded that the Y is more than just a gym ... It's part of the fabric of the Burbank community.

The Y's commitment to Youth Development, Healthy Living and Social Responsibility through a variety of programs has helped produce Olympic athletes, city government officials and numerous community and business leaders and even a few celebri-

But its day-to-day contributions to the community may go unheralded: Helping keep kids engaged through youth empowerment programs; leading the way to healthier families; helping seniors stay active through physical and social engagement; assisting people who are battling health issues; providing yearround preschool and school-aged child care; teaching thousands of children to swim each year; coordinating collection drives to gather school supplies and other essentials to meet the needs of the homeless and underserved populations; promoting community volunteerism; and so much more.

#### People like ...

Burbank High senior Katy Clawson, 17, represents the values of the Y on a daily basis. Not only does she volunteer to support Y events – including the Christmas tree lot, pancake breakfast and We Love Our Y – but is in honors/AP classes, is a member of the school dance program and works part-time. Says Katy, "I'm so happy I found the Burbank Y's Youth and Government Program, because it's the place where I have found my voice."

Maximiliano Gil, 27, who "grew-up" on the Burbank YMCA Christmas tree lot, joined the Y as a high school sophomore. But according to Max, the club helped him as much as he now helps it! His school director described him as a "good kid involved with the wrong crowd" and encouraged him to join the Y in hopes the guidance would turn him around. Now head of an architectural firm and part owner of Noho Wireless, Max applies his business and leadership acumen to spearheading the Christmas tree fundraising program to support the YMCA, the community it serves ... and other kids like him.

Maya Roseman, 30, lost 80 pounds by joining the Y and finding her place in the highcadio boxing classes offered. "I'm amazed that I have come this far," she says enthusiastically. "I'm doing things in my life I never thought I would do. I'm working out and have a new outlook on my health and the choices I

"I have never let my physical state dictate how I live my life," says Gabriel Cordell, 43, who was paralyzed from the waist down in a 1992 car accident. Honoring a personal pledge to do something "extraordinary," Gabe trained for eight months at the Y and then, in summer 2013, he made history, rolling a staggering 3,100 miles, from Los Angeles to New York, becoming the first person to cross America in a standard wheelchair. Even more amazing, he completed the epic journey in just 99 days. With a goal of aiming high to inspire others, he spoke to kids at YMCAs across the country. Now, he is planning a second run. Inspired by his mother and father – who are of Palestinian and Israeli birth, respectively - and in hopes of adding his voice to help further the peace efforts in the area, he will Roll For Peace across Israel this fall.

Bernard Wanek, 89, has been a member of the Y for 35 years and credits the exercise classes for staying healthy and active. He suggests finding a class (or a few) you enjoy and sticking with it, like his current favorites, "Sit and Tone" with Mandy and "Aqua Blast" with Kris. Betty Buxbaum, 91, a 15-year member, concurs. She particularly enjoys the "Arthritis Aquatics" program where she joins her friends.

Adds Burbank City Councilman Jess Talamantes, who also served as a Burbank firefighter for 32 years and has served the community as both Vice Mayor (2010-11) and Mayor (2011-12), "The Burbank Community Y's Youth & Government program is where I myself, as a teen, garnered interest and embarked on my path in public service."

Many members of our community are unaware that the YMCA is a non-profit that depends on donors to help sustain its good works. Your support of the Y will help fund the continuation and expansion of outreach like financial assistance to make YMCA membership available to all.

#### Looking back ...

Around the world, the YMCA is more than 160 years old and, for the past 90 years, we have had a Y in Burbank. But the Burbank Y which received the first business license issued by the city of Burbank - has come a long way since opening its doors in 1924 as a chapter of the Glendale YMCA, meeting in a single room. Today, it is housed in a threestory, 57,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art health and activities center and adjacent 18,000-square-foot Child Development Center in the heart of the Burbank community—on the site originally occupied by the First Baptist Church.

The YMCA was one of the earliest social groups to admit women, African-Americans and other ethnic groups. The Y invented basketball and volleyball; developed early programs for adult night school and group swim lessons; brought the Boy Scouts organization to the U.S.; helped launch such civic organizations as the Red Cross, USO and Toastmasters; and in the '70s, when women were returning to the workforce in record numbers, became – and remains – the nation's largest provider of child care.

## Making Changes for the Better, Marva Murphy was Selected as a "Women Achiever" for 2014

As cities and populations grew in the Burbank, Glendale, Pasadena area, female residents in the community worked behind the scenes to improve the quality of life. Twenty-five years ago, Business Life magazine, serving the business community in the three cities, sought to recognize and honor these individuals. Women Achievers recognition was born, sponsored by the Krikorian Family, publishers of Business Life magazine. Each year, businesses and organizations nominate deserving women. From this pool, 25 women are selected. Achievers are chosen based on their commitment, selflessness and determination to give back and make a difference in their communities, leading by example, inspiring those around them and breaking new ground.

Nominated by the Zonta Club of Burbank, Marva Murphy was selected as a Women Achiever for 2014.

Breaking new ground, several years ago, Murphy followed in her Mother's footsteps, as a Camp Fire leader. Except, as the mother of a son, enrolled in Burbank's first afterschool childcare at Bret Harte, she managed to create a new "image" for Camp Fire to accommodate different club situations. Murphy started the first elementary school club of Camp Fire boys and girls in Burbank, when the organization went co-educational. All children had working parents and were enrolled in childcare. Meetings took place in the evening, held twice a month vs. the typical "after-school", weekly format of the time. Murphy served as a leader for six years, until the children entered "junior high" and were spread throughout the City.

Murphy received the WoHeLo award, a special recognition from the Camp Fire National Council, for this innovation of bringing the Camp Fire experience to youth.

In 1989, she became the first woman in the Burbank Noon Lions. Her services to improve the lives of others include initiating a free hearing aid program, free eye exams and glasses for indigent and the new KidSight, free eye screening for children six months to six years. Murphy struggled to launch the KidSight project, and was successful in 2011,

with the first such program in the state of California, offered by a Lions club. In the past couple of years alone, approximately 2,000 pre-school children have been screened, finding vision problems in 10 percent.

As a member of the Burbank Noon Lions Club, she received special recognition from the International President for her contributions, and recently received her 25-year membership pin. She has been selected as "Lion of the Year" several times by fellow club members, in part for starting and chairing an International Peace Poster contest, local level, for Burbank middle school students for over 15 years. She has also been the recipient of the "Melvin Jones Fellowship" a prestigious Lions club award. With Lions, Murphy was recognized by Lions in Sight, for her dedication to eyeglass recycling and distribution around the world. As a volunteer, she participated in several eyeglass clinics bringing free eye exams and glasses to the needy, which included trips to Nepal, Venezuela, Dominican Republic, Sri Lanka and Mexico.

Before Murphy became a member of the Zonta Club of Burbank, she was selected for the Club's Burbank Woman of the Year recognition, which took on a different format at the time. Murphy was singled out for her contribution in the Youth and Education category and recognized at the annual tea. Later she became a Zonta member herself and now is an active volunteer on the Zonta Club of Burbank's annual Woman of the Year event, held the first Saturday in November.

Being in Zonta has allowed Murphy to help empower women. In April of this year, she coordinated an awareness campaign, collaborating with the Burbank Domestic Violence Task Force. The Town Center Mall artistic installation, called "Baring Their Soles" utilized donated shoes to represent the 327 reported abuse cases in Burbank in 2013.

In addition to the service organizations, Murphy has and currently serves on the Burbank Senior Board, the Zonta Club of Burbank Area Foundation as well as the recently dissolved Burbank Child Care Committee.

Following the inspection, between 11 AM and 4 PM, we will be hosting our annual Craft Faire Fundraiser! You can get an early start on your holiday shopping at nearly two dozen vendors! This is one of our major fundraisers and we need your help to make it a success!


Every year, visitors to the float construction site ask many of the same questions. The following are some of the more common. While visiting the Craft Faire, see if you can stump our expert volunteers with some new questions!

Q: When do we start building the float? A: The first welding began around the end of May however; we had to submit our float concept design to Rose Parade officials in February!

Q: When do we start decorating the float?
A: Some characters that can be removed from the float and that are covered with dry materials might be decorated in early December. Serious decorating of the float will not begin until December 26. Flowers like mums and carnations will not be applied until the 28th; maybe later if the weather is

Q: How much does the float weigh? A: It varies from year to year, but 25,000 to 30,000 lbs. is a good estimate.

Q: How many crew members are inside the float?



A: Depending on float configuration and special effects: Driver, Observer (1 or 2), Soundman, Hydraulic Engine Operator, Pyro Technician (as needed), Over-height Mechanism Operator (as needed).

Q: How long has Burbank been involved with the Tournament of

Roses Parade?

A: In 1914 Burbank's first float was titled "Goddess of Plenty." The 2015 Tournament of Roses Parade will host our 83rd float. There were several years when we had decorated cars rather than a float. There were also several years when we had no entry at all.

Q: How many awards has Burbank won?
A: We are currently on a hot streak having won 10 awards in the last 12 years! We've won several major awards: Queen's Trophy (Best Use of Roses), Animation Trophy, Fantasy Trophy (twice!), Bob Hope Humor Award and Mayor's Trophy (3 times) in competition with the professional float builders. In the 100 years that Burbank has participated, parade officials have changed the way floats are judged and the various awards. They also stopped giving actual trophies! In the very early years, there were no professional builders! After all that being said, we
