# Through the Decades, Lions Serve the Burbank Community

It was the flip of a coin that established Marty Graybill as the first president of the newly chartered Burbank Noon Lions club, in 1968. Graybill, a leading State Farm Insurance Agent in Burbank and Mike Kubasak, Director of family owned Valley Funeral Home at the time, paths, resolved to form the second Lions club. A group of older, less active Lions were meeting in the morn-

ing, but suggested to the duo that a new club of young professionals, meeting at lunchtime, would best help the residents. Graybill and Kubasak felt it was their responsibility to not only give back to the community, but to help people who did not have the resources or connections to help themselves.

As part of the chartering process for a new club, a president needed to be selected. Since it was just Kubasak and Graybill leading the way to recruit members, they decided who would be president by flipping a coin while having lunch.

So began 47 years of service to Burbank, and the initiation of vision programs in the prevention of blindness, which continues to this day. The new club worked with Burbank Unified School District (BUSD) and the School Resource Officer of the Burbank Police Department. Free eye examinations were provided for high school students, especially those who were identified with behavior issues or poor grades. The Police and BUSD both reported grades and behavior dramatically improved for the formerly troubled students following

receipt of the free exams and eyeglasses. Today's Burbank Noon Lions continue providing free eye exams and glasses for income qualifying Burbank residents of all ages. Most recently, in the quest to preserve vision, club members began the KidSight Burbank project, which offers free eye screenings for children six months to six years, in order to identify undetected vision problems affecting normal learning and development in very young children.

The early Burbank Noon Lions club also painted homes of people who were blind or handicapped; provided many Seeing Eye dogs as part of the Guide Dogs program and as a result of an affiliation with St. John's Hospital and the Lions Clinic located within the facility, saw to it that several major eye surgeries were performed for low-income residents. In addition to the vision programs, which continue, the current club also offers free exams and hearing aids for income eligible residents with hear-





# Burbank Tournament of Roses Association

In case you are reading this on October 3rd and it is not yet 4:00 PM, you need to immediately get over to our float construction site for our annual Craft Faire! You're sure to find some great gifts for someone at more than two dozen vendors! You can



In case you are reading this and it is not yet October 13th you need to mark the date and be sure to join us at California Pizza Kitchen (601 N. San Fernando Road) in Burbank for our next Dine Out Fundraiser! Be sure to download the flyer from our website before you go, then you can relax as you eat lunch and/or dinner knowing that, with every bite, you are helping to build Burbank's next Rose Parade float!

Having completed our first inspection and test drive, our efforts are now focused on getting ready for float foaming, which is usually scheduled for a couple of days after Thanksgiving! The first step is getting all the animated characters mounted on the float chassis. Next, the general contours of the float surface must be defined with a grid work of steel rods. Nearly all of this work involves welding which is beyond the skills of our typical volunteers. However, if you

have some welding skills and would like to add "worked on rose parade float" to your resume, please give us a call!

After the grid work is complete, there is plenty of work for our typical volunteers! The grid work is usually done with a six inch spacing and to fill in the gaps, it must be covered with chicken


wire. The chicken wire is fastened to the grid with hog rings. A hog ring is basically a huge staple and each one is fastened by hand, one at a time. Finally, the chicken wire is covered with old bed sheets which are fastened with hog rings, by hand, one. at. a. time.

The foam is really roofing foam and we use a contractor who sprays it where we tell him. Were it not for the bedsheets and chicken wire, the entire interior of the float chassis would be covered with a thick layer of icky sticky foam! When the foam cures in a couple of hours, it is hard enough to walk on. We use saws to cut open all the hatches. Now we are ready for volunteers to do some painting!

Our normal work schedule is Wednesdays and Saturdays between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM. The construction site is located at 123 W. Olive Ave. Please park in the Metro Link lot. Questions? 

## **Burbank Community YMCA Preschool** Launches Healthy Lunch Program

Le Cordon Bleu Chef Kindrick Brooke Creates Healthy & Fun Meals

The Burbank Community YMCA, in its continuing mission to make sure that kids grow up healthy, launched a new healthy lunch program at the Child Development Center, made possible through a generous \$5,000 grant from the Grainger Foundation. The lunches started on August 31 as an expansion of the existing healthy snacks program, and an onsite chef now cooks and serves 72 nutritious lunches in addition to 63 morning and 170 after-school snacks every

"The Child Development Center has always provided healthy snacks that align with the YMCA's Healthy Eating and Physical Activity Standards (HEPA)," noted Angela Buck, YMCA Preschool Director. "Including lunch in our program gives families extra convenience along with the confidence that their children are receiving the highest quality and most nutritious meals. Additionally, our partnership with The Fruit Guys let us provide fresh and diverse produce to the children, further introducing them to new flavors and healthy foods. It is something of which we are truly proud.

Leading the program is Chef Kindrick Brooke, a graduate of the Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts in Pasadena. When he cooks for the kids, Brooke combines 10 years of catering experience with on-the-job training provided by his three-year-old daughter. "Good ingredients taste good and my job as a chef is to not mess that up," says Brooke. "I make things that I would like to eat... and so do the kids. Even broccoli!"

Brooke has created a menu of healthy choices that kids love, while also taking allergies and dietary restrictions into consideration, making special accommodations for food sensitivities when necessary. One of his favorite recipes (for kids and adults) is green bean hummus (see sidebar for recipe). "It's a great way to incorporate vegetables into a meal, particularly when served with crudités.

The ingredients are sourced from local vendors, and sometimes parents even donate fresh vegetables from their gardens, which

Brooke incorporates into his meal planning. "A parent brought in 40 pounds of fresh tomatoes, that I made into a homemade marinara sauce, and a two-and-a-half-foot butternut squash, which I pureed and used as the base for a healthy mac 'n' cheese dish.

The meals are served family style to teach kids table manners from an early age. "I really love the whole family dining style," says Preschool teacher Priscilla Vega. "Kids learn how to serve themselves and it brings the children together as a family during lunch. It makes them feel capable and independent.

"I'm really excited to be working with the Burbank Community YMCA Child Development Center," Chef Brooke says, "not only because I love cooking, but it's also close to my home and the regular hours allow me to spend more time with my daughter.'

The Child Development Center is registering now for Preschool (ages 18 months to 5 years) and Transitional Kindergarten programs. 
