After 65 Years, Woody Bettarel, WWII B-24 Liberator

Tailgunner, Still Busy Fixing Burbank Screens

¶ven folks who've lived in Burbank "forever" d can't remember not having William "Woody" Bettarel around to fix their window and door screens. If you're 65 years old, you were a mere babe in arms when he opened Woody's Screen Center at 1509 N. San Fernando Blvd. in a little storefront behind his sister Gilda Vent's paint store, and he's been there ever since. Today, the 91-year-old World War II Army Air Corps veteran, who survived 21 missions as a B-24 Liberator tailgunner in the China-Burma-India theater, still shows up to work every day with his son Patrick (who is always wistfully asking, "Dad, when are we going to retire?").

Woody was originally from Detroit, Michigan, moving to Burbank after WWII to become a professional bowler. He bowled "for a living" for a while, says Patrick, who adds that one of his favorite photos of his parents is of them sitting in a brand new 1957 MG sports car parked in the lane of a bowling alley in Westchester (near LAX), where Woody had just won the car as first prize in a tournament.

As many people as there are in Burbank who've



known Woody "forever," as many also know his wife, Marie, who worked at Burbank's famous Smokehouse for 35 years, waiting on the likes of Sammy Davis, Jr., Johnny Carson, and Elizabeth Taylor. In fact, Woody and Marie just celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary: "They've lived in the same house in Burbank since 1947," Patrick says. As for Burbank residents — according to online reviews, Woody and Patrick are hands-down the most skilled screen repairmen in town, and any plans for retirement will be met with serious objections!

Woman of the Year

Running the studio for the famous cartoon team of Hanna-Barbera, Zita Lefebvre championed a community outreach program, which developed into her passion and her skills throughout her career. It is this passion, which led her to become part of the board for Burbank's Family Service Agency, serving as president for three years, part of the Burbank Mayor's Youth Task Force, a member of the Burbank Business Partners and creator/chair of art auction fundraisers for local non-profits. The Zonta Club of Burbank Area is recognizing these volunteer contributions on Saturday, November 7, 2015 when Lefebvre is being honored as this year's Burbank Woman of the Year at Lakeside Country Club in Toluca Lake.

Lefebvre transitioned through several companies when Turner Broadcasting bought Hanna-Barbera, Warner Bros purchased Turner and AOL bought Time-Warner. Two years after the AOL merger, in 1999, Cartoon Network decided to build a studio in Burbank and Lefebvre accepted the Director of Operations position at Cartoon Network and started working with realtors to find a space for the new studio. Lefebvre reported she "loved working in Burbank, where one could walk around the corner and speak with the City Manager." During this process, she realized Cartoo

with the City Manager." During this process, she realized Cartoon Network Studios needed to partner with the City and developed the idea of "Community Relations" for the company.

Several years before being promoted to Director of Operations and Community Relations in

Several years before being promoted to Director of Operations and Community Relations in 2011, she established the annual donation program, receiving requested grant funding from the company's corporate offices. The Boys and Girls Club, Family Service Agency, BCR A Place to Grow, Stevenson Elementary School, Kids' Community Dental Clinic were all recipients, along with funding to send 20 children to camp and summer scholarships for local students at Woodbury University.

Her interaction with the City gave her the idea to establish Burbank Shares, starting with chairs that had been upgraded and stored in the Cartoon Network warehouse. Through this program, she organized a system whereby registered Burbank non-profits and schools could benefit from equipment and supplies donated by companies upgrading, moving or downsizing. The Cartoon Network chairs made their way to Burbank Adult School bringing many smiles to the students. Local non-profits received computers, office furniture, telephone systems and supplies at no cost, resulting in major savings for their operating budgets and the companies benefited through taxable donations.

A transplanted New Yorker, with no qualms about leaving winter behind, Lefebvre realized her love for gardening when she was able to do so in the middle of February as a new resident of Southern California, several years ago. Gardening became her avocation and recently she graduated from a Master Gardener's program. Wanting to combine her experience with gardens and her love of children, she became a volunteer and helped build a gardening project for the students of Stevenson Elementary School. Working with the children, she recruited volunteers to help maintain the garden and introduced the kids to composting via the Burbank Recycling Center's programs. Money was raised for the Stevenson garden when Lefebvre organized a Cartoon Network's Farmer's Market for employees, where the student's fresh, organic vegetables were eagerly purchased. Now, part of the Burbank School Garden Foundation, Lefebvre dreams of establishing a garden in every school in the City, and introducing healthy eating along with the skills to raise organic vegetables.

In conjunction with the artists at Cartoon Network, Lefebvre started their volunteer program. From this grew the "Young Writer's Program". Three short, animated films resulted. Mr. Pike was created with students at Stevenson Elementary School, You Are Special, produced at Jordan Middle School and Revelations, a public service announcement, was developed with the Boys and Girls Club.

After leaving Cartoon Network in December, Lefebvre decided to concentrate her volunteer efforts in support of the many important services offered by Burbank's Family Service Agency, as well as the expansion of the school gardening program.



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Burbank Tournament of Roses Association

The Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day is almost like a fairy tale with a queen, princesses, imaginary animal characters and animated fantasy scenes! But fairy tales also have villains. Last month, I described the very real problems that the continuing drought has caused.

This month's villain appears as a quarantine which limits the floral materials that will be allowed on the floats. The California Department of Food & Agriculture has noti-Tournament officials Huanglongbing (HLB) infected citrus trees have been found in the San Gabriel area of Los Angeles County and that a quarantine area covering 180 square miles includes parts of Pasadena and a large portion of the parade route. HLB is carried by the Asian citrus psyllid which spreads the disease from tree to tree as it feeds on juices in the flowers, leaves and stems. The bottom line is that all plants from the Rutaceae family (ie. lemon, lime, orange, mandarin, kumquat, and 50+ others) will not be allowed to be used on any floats! Only completely dried stems, leaves, peels, seeds and whole fruit without stems and leaves may be used. For Burbank, the heroes in this drama are our Decoration Committee which is working hard to find alternate materials that will be just as spectacular!

The first major milestone for our float is barely a month away! The Mechanical www.BurbankRoseFl Inspection & Test Drive (MI/T1) is the first on Facebook, too!





delegations when they visited Burbank in late July.

The Burbank Y has partnered with PathPoint to provide training opportunities for developmentally disabled individuals from the local community since 2001. This program allows developmentally disabled persons (as determined by the State of California) to receive employment in a noncompetitive workplace alongside others of similar skills and ability levels. Employees receive extensive onsite job coaching to instill the work ethic and job skills necessary to seek outside employment.

The Y currently employs three individuals through the PathPoint program, part-time, three days a week, along with their supervisor, doing light maintenance. In addition to serving as a PathPoint GSE, the Burbank Y also employs one developmentally disabled person on a part-time, permanent basis.

Brett Archer, Burbank Community

YMCA Facilities Director, notes that "They are a big help and value to us."

Said Kristie Whalen, PathPoint Support Plan Coordinator, LA County, "The Burbank Community YMCA is an important part of the PathPoint mission. The success of our program with them will help us to expand to other GSE sites, which we are actively pursuing."

Added Yvette Herrera, Director of Philanthropy & Community Engagement for the Burbank Y, "The Burbank Community YMCA is proud to partner with an organization that shares our mission to provide opportunities to all people to become stronger in spirit, mind and body. 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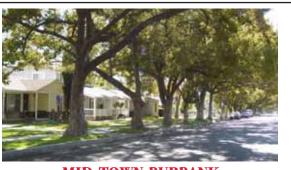


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
