'Summertime in February' – Brad Korb's Market Update Filled with Good News!

The latest market update from Brad Korb is brimming with great news. First, interest rates have dropped to approximately 3.75%, the lowest they've been in 20 months. Second, lending institutions Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae have lowered their minimum down payment requirements from 5% to 3% of the home's purchase price. Third, the FHA has lowered the monthly impound cost of private mortgage insurance, making it affordable enough to bring an estimated 90,000 to 140,000 more buyers on the market.

"It may be February," says Korb, "but it's more like summertime in terms of an extremely vibrant real estate market. Thanks to these three changes, buyers are coming out of the woodwork





Let me offer a final "congratulations" to all the volunteers from the community who worked on Burbank's prize-winning float, Jungle Rescue! This is the first time that Burbank has captured the Past President's Trophy and brings our current record to 7 awards in the last 8 tries! Many of those same volunteers put in another fantas-

tic effort on Deconstruction Day as they washed dozens of buckets, thousands of flower vials and, of course, took the float apart!

The Design Contest for Burbank's 2016 float is now closed. On February 5th the General Membership will vote for their most preferred concepts. During the second week of February, members of our Board of Directors will register our newest design concept with Tournament officials in Pasadena during Theme Draft. Upon arrival at Tournament House, each float builder picks a number from a jar ... one number for each float they will build. Since Burbank will build only one float, we get only one number. The builder who selected #1 submits his design first. The builder with #2 goes next and so on. The



ranking of the design concepts established by the General Membership becomes important during Theme Draft. If we picked a high number, there may be too many float concepts that feature butterflies or bears or balloons, etc. by the time our turn comes. If so, we may need to go with our second or even third choice!

Our next project will be to create a mini-float for Burbank On Parade! This year the parade theme is "Burbank – City of the Wild, Wild West." At present, we have saved all the characters from our Rose Parade float. Once the chairman is selected, the committee will develop a design and decide what can be reused for this community celebration. The parade is scheduled for April 25 so there is not much time!
